A MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

So Jesus said again, "I am telling you the truth: I am the gate for the sheep. All others who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever comes in by me will be saved; they will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only in order to steal, kill, and destroy. I have come in order that you might have life - life in all its fullness.

This passage from last Sunday's Gospel is a reminder to all of us about Jesus being the Good Shepherd. It is so fitting for our students in Years 3/4 in particular, some who are leading up to the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the next few weeks.

Jesus reminds us that we are His flock; the sheep. As his sheep we are reminded that he is the gate by which we are called and to enter through this gate. At times we can fall short and look to find 'greener pastures.' However Jesus never gives up on us - he always seeks to find us and help to restore our faith

Having life 'in all its fullness' means to have life in abundance. As Catholics we are called to live 'life in abundance' meaning to be blessed with the Fruits of the Holy Spirit. These fruits are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. When we stray from Jesus we feel a sense that things are not quite right. Whether this is in our relationships between ourselves and others or we might just feel a little bit 'broken' in ourselves.

This week I would like you to stop and reflect on the following questions. (1) What within me is yearning to be cared for, forgiven or loved? (2) Who needs forgiveness in my life?

I pray for you all and in particular I ask you to join me in prayers for our Reconciliation candidates that we <u>ALL</u> may have 'life in all its fullness'.

IMPORTANT DRIVEWAY REMINDERS

DO NOT park your car in front of this gate and shed. This impacts any cars trying to turn out or back out of the car park.





THIS is the only gate to exit from (turn your vehicle left out of). Remembering our driveway is a one way 'drive through' driveway

THREE important reminders

- In the morning and the afternoon drivers are to move as far down the driveway as they can. You must be aware of other vehicles driving behind you.
- Children must get into and out of the car on the **passenger side** of the car (**NOT** the door behind the driver!) as this will stop students from walking between two cars.

BODY IMAGE SURVIVAL

What do you look like?
Are you short or tall? Is your hair blonde, brown, black or ginger?
Do you have big muscles?
Are your clothes in fashion?
Is your face covered in freckles?
These days there's so much pressure on people, especially young people to look and dress in a certain way. But too often, these expectations cause unwanted problems.



There is no such thing as a perfect body/look.

Most of us wish we could change something about ourselves. That's okay, but can become a problem if that's all you think about!

Body image is the way you think and feel about your body. A healthy body image is about accepting the type of body you have and being comfortable with it. It's not about comparing yourself to others, it's about knowing that there's more to you than just the way you look!

The important thing is not the shape of your body, but how healthy it is. Healthy bodies come in many different shapes and sizes. Remember to eat well, drink lots of water and exercise regularly. That's what matters!

SUNSMART

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world.

In Victoria, from September through to the end of April, average UV levels are 3 and above, which is when UV radiation can damage skin and eyes and lead to skin cancer. When the UV Index is 3 and above:

- 1. Slip on sun-protective clothing
- 2. Slop on SPF30+, broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards
- 3. Slap on a hat that protects your face, head, neck and ears
- 4. Seek shade
- **5. Slide** on some sunglasses make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Holy Child is a SunSmart School and we enforce **NO HAT NO PLAY**.

Children must wear the school hat during the break times at school.

FOOD AND DRINK

During warmer weather, DRINK MORE WATER

As the weather warms up it is important that our children drink regularly.

Children will need a clearly named and refillable drink bottle.

Please do not send food that needs reheating.

Due to health and safety, we are unable to heat children's food at school.

During cooler weather

As the weather cools, ensure children are appropriately dressed for cold rainy days and if they are wearing a beanie or gloves that they are navy blue or black.

Beanies are available for purchase at the School.


















Ready Set Work Barista
