#### A MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

#### **Eucharist**

#### **REMINDERS**

- 1. Just a reminder that the annual MACS School Improvement Survey for parents is vital in the work we, as a school community, do to make sure that we are always focussed on improving our school. - 2. Starting next term cars will not be allowed to park at the front of the school. The front of the school will be 'Kiss and Drop' only. Unless you are parking to drop a child to the kindergarten.
- 3. We have become aware that some of our students are using social media at home, such as, 'TikTok' and to use these platforms, account holders need to be aged 13 years or older. All of our students are under 13 years of age and it is not legal for them to have an account. Holy Child will always put the safety of our children first and as we know these platforms can be used by predators to groom children online and accounts held by people who claim to be somebody else. This is our biggest concern and we ask families to monitor time spent on computers.

Children playing outside the school grounds, before and after school, are not supervised until 8.30am before school and up to 3.40pm after school. #### **SUNSMART**

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world.

In Victoria, from September through to the end of April, average UV levels are 3 and above, which is when UV radiation can damage skin and eyes and lead to skin cancer. When the UV Index is 3 and above:

- 1. Slip on sun-protective clothing
- 2. **Slop on** SPF30+, broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards
- 3. **Slap** on a hat that protects your face, head, neck and ears
  - 4. Seek shade
  - 5. **Slide** on some sunglasses make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Holy Child is a SunSmart School and we enforce **NO HAT NO PLAY**.

Children must wear the school hat during the break times at school.

# During warmer weather, DRINK MORE WATER

As the weather warms up it is important that our children drink regularly.

Children will need a clearly named and refillable drink bottle.

Please do not send food that needs reheating.

Due to health and safety, we are unable to heat children's food at school.

#### During cooler weather

As the weather cools, ensure children are appropriately dressed for cold rainy days and if they are wearing a beanie or gloves that they are navy blue or black.

Beanies are available for purchase at the School.



## **IMPORTANT DRIVEWAY REMINDERS**

**DO NOT** park your car in front of this gate and shed. This impacts any cars trying to turn out or back out of the car park.





**THIS** is the only gate to exit from (turn your vehicle left out of). Remembering our driveway is a one way 'drive through' driveway

#### **THREE** important reminders

- In the morning and the afternoon drivers are to move as far down the driveway as they can. You must be aware of other vehicles driving behind you.
- Children must get into and out of the car on the **passenger side** of the car (**NOT** the door behind the driver!) as this will stop students from walking between two cars.

#### Recount - The importance of talking about your day

Talking with children is important because it builds your child's language and communication skills. By creating opportunities for your child to re-tell stories you can support your child's understanding of how stories work. This is a great way to support early literacy skills and will help with reading comprehension and their development of simple sentence construction.

When you go on an outing or holiday with your child take a few photos of things happening around you. For example, during a trip to the farm, take photos as your child feeds the animals, goes on a ride, or eats lunch. Later, look at the photos together and use them to help guide your child to recount what happened at the farm. By placing the pictures in a sequence, it opens an opportunity for you to support your child's understanding of sequence and related vocabulary such as 'first', 'next', and 'last'. Get your child to conclude with an "closing statement" such as "when we go back, we looked at the pictures and..." or "I really liked going to the farm because...."

Encourage your child to include who is the picture, what they are doing and where they are.

You could create your own personalised book as a fun and personal way to enhance your child's language skills.



- 3. Exhibits to be completed by ONE person only except for Group Projects.
- 4. All exhibits MUST be original and be certified as having been completed at School. All exhibits are to be clearly labelled with an official exhibit card. This card must be attached to the front top right-hand side of 2D exhibits and within the boundary of the exhibit. Cards will be forwarded directly from ShowDay Online with your receipt / invoice upon acceptance of your entries.
- Full payment to be made by credit card via the online entry system when entries are completed or via direct credit
- All PRIZE MONEY will be forwarded to the School after the Show.
- All exhibits are to be appropriately packaged for ease of transportation. All submissions MUST be clearly labelled with: School Name and Year level where appropriate.
- 8. 2D and written works e.g paintings, stories, poetry, should be submitted in an art folio or similar with the school name clearly visible. Entries will be returned to the school in the same folios.
- 9. 3D items should be in a suitable container that is clearly labelled with school name. It is the responsibility of the school to ensure fragile items are packed correctly (e.g ceramic, collage, modelling). Stewards will ensure all packing materials are used for the return to the school. All entries will be returned to the school in the same containers.
