A MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

"Dear friends, celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation means being enfolded in a warm embrace: it is the embrace of the Father's infinite mercy." Pope Francis

From the beginning Jesus' followers used to meet, to listen to stories about his life, to pray and to do what Jesus did by sharing bread and wine in memory of him. In these special meals they celebrated that Jesus lived on with them. In the many centuries since Jesus' death and resurrection, Catholic Christians have developed seven special signs of Jesus' living on with us - we call these the seven sacraments. For Catholics, Reconciliation is the sacrament Catholics celebrate after Baptism and at Holy Child Primary School, this happens for students in Year Three.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation celebrates something that Catholic people believe is always with us ... *God's love and forgiveness*. Reconciliation is a sacrament of healing and forgiveness.

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test.

In our tradition of faith, the Catholic tradition, we believe in forgiveness. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that God loves and forgives us and that we should do the same. In the Lord's Prayer (Our Father), we pray for God to forgive us just as we forgive others. In being forgiven, we are able to more fully appreciate the liberating love of our gracious God.

We ask for continued prayers for our Reconciliation candidates who are celebrating this sacrament next Wednesday, 24 May at 6:00pm.

DO NOT park your car in front of this gate and shed. This impacts any cars trying to turn out or back out of the car park.






THIS is the only gate to exit from (turn your vehicle left out of). Remembering our driveway is a one way 'drive through' driveway

The crown symbol is attributed to Mary because she is the Mother of the Son of God, who is our Heavenly King.



PREP

Marvellous Melbourne Museum

Last week the Preps went on their first excursion to the Melbourne Museum.

The Prep classrooms were alive with a buzz of excitement, as we were preparing to get on board the bus to go to the museum. The Preps looked so little sitting on the big bus with their friends. It was lovely to hear someone exclaim; "I've never been on a big bus like this before!"

When we arrived at the Melbourne Museum and we walked into the building the Preps stood in awe of the huge dinosaur skeleton near the entrance.

Then we went into the It's a Bugs World session led by museum staff. This was where the Preps learnt about what an entomologist is (a person who studies insects). The Preps became little investigators in this session and used magnifying glasses to take a closer look at lots of different insects.

Next we went through the Dinosaur Walk, where we were surrounded by lots of different dinosaur skeletons and animated dinosaurs projected on the walls around us. We walked into a room where there was a storm and a T- Rex came prowling by.

After the break, we walked through the new Gandel Gondwana Garden, which is an outdoor gallery that explores the changing landscapes of Victoria and the creatures that once walked the land.

The Mini Mega Model Museum was the next section of the museum that we explored. The Preps liked looking at the displays and any parts that were interactive that they could touch.

Lastly, we visited Bugs Alive! Where the Preps were shocked at how many different bugs they could see. They were interested in looking at, describing and knowing the names of all the bugs. Some bugs were so tiny and others were so big. Some of the bugs were hard to see because they were camouflaged in their enclosure so well.

Mr Marchione and I are beyond proud of how well behaved all the Preps were. They were so curious about everything at the museum, engaged in learning and demonstrated their interest by asking questions and literally dragging the adults over to look at things. They were great representatives of Holy Child School and have made Mr M and I keen to plan other excursions.

We would like to thank the LSOs, parents and volunteers who came with us and supported us, to ensure that we all had a wonderful time on the excursion.



All of your bones together form a skeleton that supports your body. Your muscles cover the bones and pull them around so that your body can move.


The bones and muscles all work together. Without them, you wouldn't be able to walk or dance or run. You wouldn't be able to sit or stand or even talk!

- A baby has more bones than a grown-up. You have about 300 bones when you are born. But, as
 you grow some of the bones join together (or fuse). By the time you've stopped growing you will
 only have 206 bones!
- As the day goes on, did you know you get shorter! You are about 1 cm shorter at the end of the day from when you get up in the morning!
- The muscles you use for blinking your eyes are the fastest in your body!
- The biggest muscle in your body is the gluteus maximus. It's in your bottom!

Your bones also protect the major organs of your body. The skull protects your brain, The vertebrae in your back protects your spinal cord and your ribs protect your heart and lungs!

SUNSMART

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world.

In Victoria, from September through to the end of April, average UV levels are 3 and above, which is when UV radiation can damage skin and eyes and lead to skin cancer. When the UV Index is 3 and above:

- 1. Slip on sun-protective clothing
- 2. Slop on SPF30+, broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards
- 3. Slap on a hat that protects your face, head, neck and ears
- 4. Seek shade
- **5. Slide** on some sunglasses make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Holy Child is a SunSmart School and we enforce **NO HAT NO PLAY**.

Children must wear the school hat during the break times at school.

FOOD AND DRINK

During warmer weather, DRINK MORE WATER

As the weather warms up it is important that our children drink regularly.

Children will need a clearly named and refillable drink bottle.

Please do not send food that needs reheating.

Due to health and safety, we are unable to heat children's food at school

During cooler weather

As the weather cools, ensure children are appropriately dressed for cold rainy days and if they are wearing a beanie or gloves that they are navy blue or black.
